PURPOSE

This *Theresa Reid Memorial CWL Scholarship* is to assist young women with post-secondary education and the call to service and leadership.

CRITERIA

Who is eligible? Student parishioners of St Patrick's Parish, currently in their graduating year, who will be attending a Canadian post-secondary institution in the fall to pursue a course of study leading to a degree or diploma from an accredited university or community college of their choice, are eligible.

APPLICATION

Applications are available from the parish office, CWL (867) 873-5900 or at the Co-Cathedral Church Bulletin Entrance, during the month of April and May. The completed application and supporting documents must be returned no later than June 1st addressed to the attention of the Chairperson, CWL Bursary Committee. The award will be announced at the Sunday Mass no later than June 30th of the same year.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

The following supporting documents must be included with the application:

- Letter of recommendation from a teacher at your school.
- Photocopy of your baptismal and confirmation certificate.
- Transcript of your current mid-term marks or up-to-date high school transcript.
- The applicant will explain in writing how they demonstrate each of the core Catholic faith formation values of faith, hope, love, dignity of the person, excellence, community, stewardship for creation and justice. The candidate should speak to these areas in terms of their experience with service and leadership. Please see the Bursary Appendix to help guide you in completing the application.

AWARD

\$500.00 will be awarded each year. The presentation will be made to the winning student's after mass by the Chairperson. Congratulation announcement will follow in the Parish bulletin.

RECEIPT OF AWARD

Upon acceptance to a university or community college, a copy of that acceptance must be mailed or given to the CWL. Following this, the CWL will issue a cheque to the recipient.

GUIDELINE

The applicant's studies (attendance at university or college) must commence within one year of the receipt of the award.

Catholic Character Formation

- Faith – Catholic graduates integrate faith with life.
- Excellence – Catholic graduates develop and demonstrate their God-given potential.

Theresa Reid 1933-2010

This award was created in memory of Theresa Reid and others like her where service and leadership creates a more compassionate community.

Theresa, a CWL member in Yellowknife was a pillar in her church and performed outstanding service and other charitable works in her community. With the help of others she was instrumental in organizing a Parish Flea Market in Yellowknife, Northwest Territories (now called the Vinnies Thrift Store). The Store was formerly housed in space in St. Patrick Church and previous to that in makeshift places. Theresa, with the help of family and friends managed, recycled used items for some 20 years before the fire in 2017. Her outstanding dedication earned her the Queen's Golden Jubilee Award and the National Volunteer Award and the Paul Harris Fellow Award.

The last award was presented for tangible and significant assistance and leadership through service and for the furtherance of better understanding and friendly relations around the world. She was compassionate about those in need not just the parish but the community at large. Many would ask for help to find some needed item. Many of the poor in Yellowknife knew her and felt welcomed. Recycling helped not people but also the environment. She exemplified CWL values and service.

The Catholic Women's League of Canada calls its members to grow in faith, and to witness to the love of God through ministry and service.
