Special envelopes are available at the exits of the church. Mass intentions will be offered at each mass.



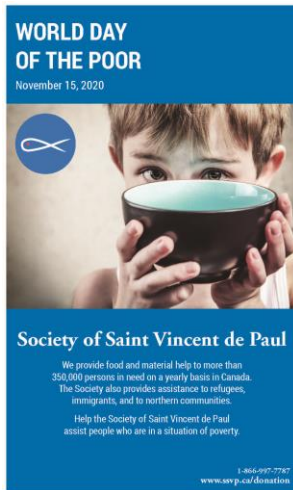
All Souls Day Celebrations

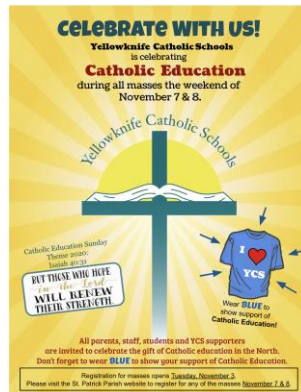
poor with dignity and respect regardless of personal creed or background; we ask you to do the same. Encourage others to donate.

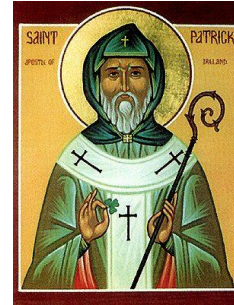
